Dear Friends in Christ,

We live in a broken world. I suppose that comes as no surprise to many of you. After all, we are reminded of the brokenness every single day when we turn on the television, open a magazine, or surf on the internet. The news is littered with the latest events of crime, war, terrorism, and tragedy. With the broadcast of the 2018 Olympics in Pyeongchang, South Korea, it was a welcomed break from the chaotic stories to which we have become uncomfortably accustomed. It is sad, isn't it, that the current state of affairs in our world today has become the norm?

Last evening, as I was convincing myself I should head to bed, a news broadcast came on the tv stating that there was a possible gun shooting threat for the next morning to take place at Gila Ridge High School. I immediately clicked on my cell phone and began looking at the various news reports, Yuma Union School District website, and various comments that were being made on Facebook to verify that I heard the news report correctly. As a parent, I was greatly concerned and a whirlwind of thoughts swirled in my mind. "Is this a sick joke? Am I getting ahead of myself? Should I call my wife who is at work? Is my mother still up...maybe she can give me some advice?" The questions just kept coming in rapid succession. I ended up waking my daughter up to ask her if she had heard anything about this threat, to which she said it was news to her. Internally, I was writhing with concern, worry, and fear. Should I keep the kids home from school in the morning? After speaking with my wife, we agreed that we would prefer to error on the side of caution. Soon after verifying the news reports, the school cancelled school for the day. That was a relief, to say the least. With the report that law enforcement deduced through their investigation that the threat was no longer valid, my family and I were put at ease. Nevertheless, the damage had been done.

I stayed home to be with my children since they were home from school as a result of the threat scare. The whole day, I couldn't help but think about the events from the night before. With the events of Ash Wednesday's mass shooting in Parkland, Florida still flooding the headlines in the news and on the internet, I was struggling with the idea that such an event could occur here in our community. As so many of you have shared with me, we never worried about someone bringing a gun to school to perpetrate such a horrendous act. I think we all agree, or at least I hope we all do, that our children shouldn't be afraid to go to school, neither should those who work in the education system. Our

schools should be a safe haven of learning for our youth. Unfortunately, as much as we desire that such events don't take place, this has become too common and frequent of a problem. This has become somewhat of the "norm" in our society. Gone are the days of just having fire drills. Now, our youth must be drilled how to respond "when" the unthinkable occurs. This makes me sad...and I know it saddens many others.

We live in a broken world. But, we do not live as though we have no hope. One of the things that I heard said from parents and students alike from Florida was that they didn't want prayers...they wanted action. Dear friends, I know that sometimes it feels as though our prayers go unanswered or that they are nothing more than murmured words that garner no merit. Nothing could be further from the truth. Our Lord hears ALL of our cries for help...AND...He answers every single prayer. Yes, action needs to take place to ensure the safety of our youth and any in the education system. At the same time, prayer is powerful and God ALWAYS answers our prayers in the way that is best for us...even when we disagree with His answer. This is why God, in His mercy and grace, sent His Son into this broken world to make right what mankind had spoiled through sin. Hanging on that cross, Jesus received into Himself ALL of our brokenness, saving us from our broken, sinful selves and assuring us of forgiveness, life, and salvation. Knowing that we have been saved, we have hope even in the midst of worry, concern, fear, helplessness, and despair. And, this hope does not disappoint as we are blessed to live every day of our earthly life in His grace with the assurance of eternal life.

Sometimes, it feels as though God is so distant...so far away...unaware of the very things that haunt our dreams. This, however, is not the case. As a dear winter visitor of our congregation has reminded me often, God is still in control. God is very aware of what happens. He knows what keeps us awake at night. He is not far away, but continues to remain steadfast and true...our ever-present help in trouble. God hears our prayers and He answers every last one of them, giving us what we need...what is best for us...even when, in the moment, it might not feel that way. Like so many others, I, too, need to be reminded of God's love and that when I am concerned, worried, fearful, or despairing, the cross of Jesus stands before me as the reminder of God's greatest act of love...a love that promises forgiveness...life...and salvation. Be strong in the Lord and know that God is still in control.
