Dear Friends in Christ,

Mission and ministry: These are just a couple of words that describe and define Calvary Lutheran Church. From the very moment that Calvary was born in Yuma, mission and ministry has been at the very heart of Calvary's existence. Providing a place for German prisoners of war to worship during World War II...to supporting refugees from war-stricken countries...to conceiving and growing a Lutheran school in the community...to even educating and shaping numerous men into Lutheran pastors (this pastor being just one of the many) are just a few of the ways this congregation has lived her mission and performed ministry in the midst of the desert. For more than 78 years now, the people of this church have served to bring the Gospel of Jesus Christ to countless men, women, and children to this unique and precious town, and the results of their labor are still felt and seen to this very day.

By the time you receive this newsletter, the events of which I share with you will have already taken place. But, it is my prayer that in sharing, all of you will be filled with great joy and appreciation for the work our loved ones and fellow congregants invested because of their love for Christ to take His Great Commission to heart and make disciples right here in Yuma!

On April 22nd, I was privileged and tremendously honored to preach the sermon for the installation of Pastor Jonathan Stites as the pastor at Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran Church here in the Yuma Foothills. I am always moved when participating in the ordination/installation of one of my brothers in the Holy Ministry. Gathered together in one accord, pastors surround the man whom God has called to shepherd His people on earth through Word and Sacrament ministry, to lay their hands on him and offer words of blessing and peace. It is certainly a day to remember for we are all witnesses of God's promise to send laborers into the harvest field of His church on earth to feed the sheep with the good grazing land of God's Word and leading them to the living waters of His Spirit.

Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran Church has come a long way with the help of the Lord from their humble beginnings many years ago! As many of you are aware, I served as a vicar right here at Calvary Lutheran Church

back in 1999-2000 under the pastoral supervision of the late Reverend Steve Sanderson. Back then, Pastor Sanderson and I would rotate weekly on Sunday mornings when it came to leading worship at the mission congregation in the foothills of Yuma. In a tiny church building of another denomination, Lutheran Christians in the foothills would gather together to worship. It was Calvary Lutheran Church who planted that mission start and continued to serve it over the years as it began to sprout and grow. At that time, there were very few homes out there and the church building was surrounded by sand and gravel. During my time as a vicar, Pastor Sanderson began the conversation among people at Calvary as well as in the foothills about transferring their membership to the foothills mission congregation to begin the process of becoming their own congregation. Also at that time, the Gila Mountain Methodist Church was building a new place of worship right off of Frontage Road by Foothills Boulevard and their current church building would be going up for sale. Things started to get pretty exciting as the possibility of the mission congregation purchasing their own building in which to meet and worship looked like a reality. My vicarage had ended and my wife and I had already returned to Fort Wayne, Indiana to the seminary before the sale of the Methodist church was finalized. Pastor Kent Schaaf was the vicar blessed to see that event take place and the mission congregation worship in their new church building for the very first time. It would take several years before the mission congregation would become what is appropriately known today as Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran Church.

Being able to be a part of this wonderful day some 20 years later fills me with a sense of awe and From humble beginnings to a thriving congregation serving man with the Gospel shows just how amazing our Lord really is. Our Lord tells us that His Word never returns to Him empty or void. Witnessing how the Word of the Lord has endured and grown Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran Church is an assurance that God will continue to be with His church on earth as He continues to call men, like Pastor Stites, into the harvest field to tend the flock of God's people with His Word and Means of Grace. And for this church in the foothills, to think that it began with a pastor and few faithful people who once called Calvary Lutheran Church home. How truly and remarkably blessed we all are!


